Looking Back

This past year was another good one for our club. As I took over as President in January, I had a number of goals. Some of these have been achieved while others are still on the "to-do list". We have improved our outreach and information-sharing for new members and visitors, with a new member orientation table available at each club meeting. We've coordinated our mentor program for new members, and have done a good job getting new turners hooked up with experienced members who can help and enlighten the new folks.

The third Oregon Woodturning Symposium happened in March, and it was a great success. Our club was well-represented, staffing our room, the reception desk and the silent auction area. That operation is entirely dependent on volunteers, and our membership did a great job. There's always room for more help, though, and the next Symposium will be here before we know it.

As we do each year, the club staffed display areas at the Great Oregon Steam-Up and at the Oregon State Fair. These two events are our primary recruiting tools and are great ways for you to introduce the public to the art and craft of woodturning. We had more help in each booth in 2019 with some new club members jumping in to assist, backed up by a lot of the regulars at each event.

Our November Auction netted just over \$1,700 for the club's treasury. This amount is better than our last auction, but half of the amount realized in 2015. The Board will – again – examine if an auction is the best use of a club meeting or if we should plan something different. Your input on this matter is always welcome.

Looking Ahead

By now you're all aware of the very large community outreach event we have scheduled for October 11, 2020. **Empty Bowls 2020** has an ambitious goal of 150 soup/salad sized bowls being produced by our club. I'm sure you've all had the opportunity to look at the Statesman Journal's coverage of our efforts so far, but if not the article and photos are still available online. This event is another one that will depend on the membership to succeed. We will need bowls, we will need staff at the October event, and we will need assistance with ticket sales as the date draws near.

I mentioned the Empty Bowls event first because it has the longest lead-time, but we have others to plan for as well. State Fair and Steam-Up are already on the horizon, and we will need both coordination assistance and demonstrators for each. Mark your calendars.

Finally: as 2019 draws to a close, sooner or later our thoughts will turn to Tax Day on April 15, 2020. The Willamette Valley Woodturners is a 501(c)(3) charitable organization, and in that capacity, your donation to the club is 100% tax deductible. Several baked items were presented for silent auction

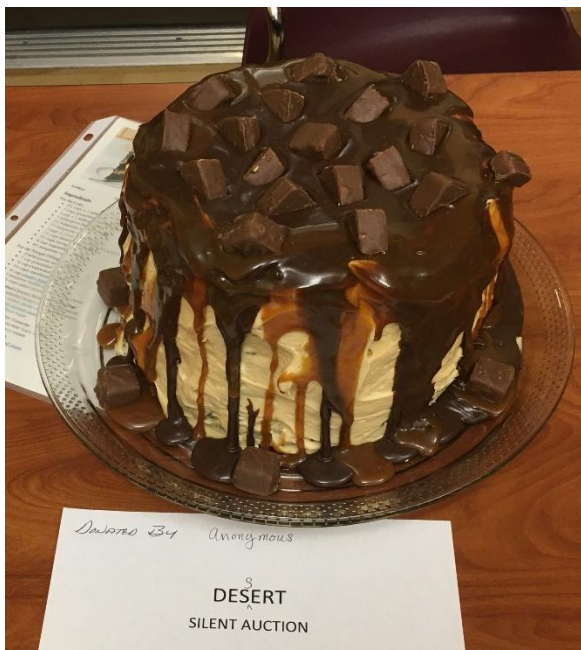
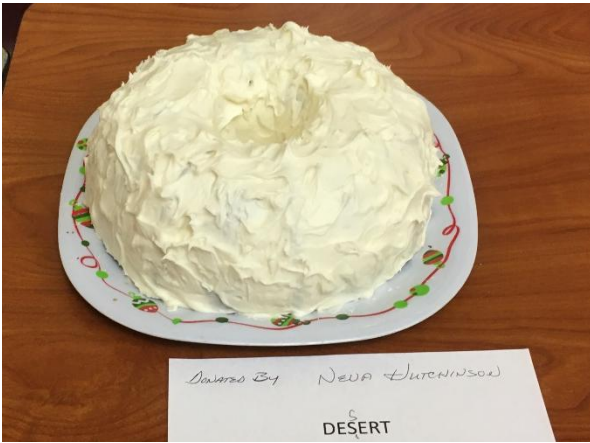


Figure 1 Gary Dahrens setting down the bidding ground rules.

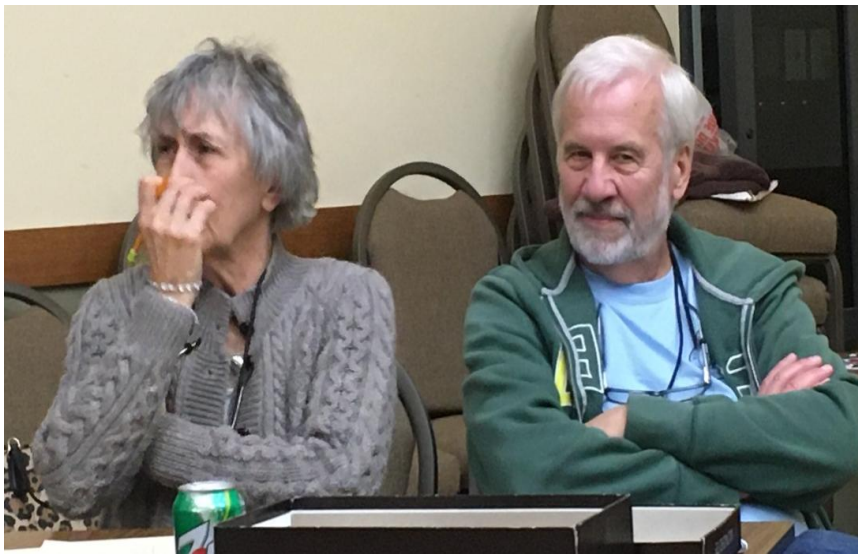


Figure 3 Henrik had excellent help assigning auction cards, keeping track of successful bids, and collecting the money. We greatly appreciate their oversight.

January 9 - Demonstrator Dan Tilden:

Saturday 1/11 workshop. \$100 per student. Wood and lunch provided, Tools optional.

This hands on workshop class will focus on learning how to turn and complete a hollow vessel. Either if you have hollowing experience or none; students will learn how to turn a hollow vessel from start to finish or improve their hollowing skills they already have. We will start by turning a smaller simple bowl or open form making practice cuts on the inside with different hollowing tools to get a good understanding how the tools are cutting. This will allow us to easily see what it takes to make a clean accurate cuts with different available hollowing tools before we start a more challenging hollow form. We will also go over effective tool grip techniques, body stances, and sharpening our cutter tips to reduce vibrations for clean cuts.

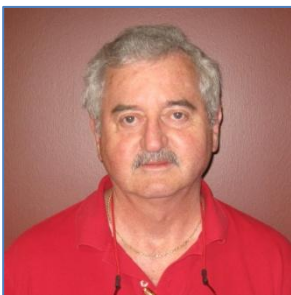

Chain Sharpening Service from [Jeff Zens](#)

I have recently purchased an electric chain sharpener and can accurately sharpen your chains and adjust your depth stops for your saw chains. This will restore the chain to “factory-new” condition. Most chains can be sharpened for \$10.00, but longer chains or badly damaged chains might be a little bit more. This service is only available for club members.

I am a distributor for Stick Fast CA glue, Sharpfast Sharpening systems, the Holdfast vacuum chucking system and Saburrtooth Carving bits. If you have an interest in these products, give me a call or send me an [email](#) for details.

Supplies

The club purchases a few supplies in bulk and sells it to members at club cost. We routinely have superglue (\$5), black or brown superglue (\$10) accelerator (\$10) and Anchorseal (\$9/gal). The club has a small supply of half round protractors (\$6) used to measure the angle ground on a tool, and depth gauges (\$5). HSS Round Tool Bits rods (1/4" x 8") are also available (\$3). Jerry Lelack will have the resale items available at the meetings, except for Anchorseal which is available through [Jeff Zens](#). You will need to bring your own gallon jug; contact Jeff to make arrangements.
