AnchorSeal

We are completely sold out of AnchorSeal. Club members who have attended the past several interactive remote demonstrations will recall that both Mike Mahoney and Glenn Lucas have switched to a PVA-based end grain sealer. I have requested samples of one of these products for evaluation by our club, and if the results are positive I will suggest a switch from AnchorSeal to the PVA material. Benefits of the PVA sealer include lower cost (because it is sold as a concentrate, which you mix with water at home) and the elimination of slippery floors in front of your lathe if you're turning a lot of material sealed with the wax emulsion. If any club member has tried any PVA-based end grain sealer, PLEASE contact me to share your experiences, either good or bad. We will also evaluate AnchorSeal II at the same time; if you have used this product in the past (not sold through the Club) please let me know.

Club Meetings Resuming
