### Let the Chips Fly

Now that the weather is getting nicer, it is harder to spend as much time inside turning. I do have to make time however, to turn a couple of lidded bowls for the "Beads of Courage" project. It seems like a very worthwhile project for me to do.

As you may recall, in April I mentioned Ralph Brennan's Craftsman lathe. I found out Philomath Middle School had a lathe just like it. So they now possess 3 of the same type lathe for their students to learn on. Dick Powell mentors a woodworking program at the middle school and he already has students using the one lathe that they had. Now more students will have the opportunity to turn. Ralph's family was pleased that the lathes went to a community where they will be used and appreciated.

It is time to start thinking about the two annual summer turning activities that we have been doing for many years. As usual, we are looking for volunteers to demonstrate at the Antique Powerland Steam Up and the Oregon State Fair. The Steam Up runs the last weekend in July, 25th and 26th, and the first weekend in August, 1st and 2nd. We need volunteers, usually 10 or 12, but could use as many as we can get. We will have sign-up sheets at our meetings starting on the 14th of May. For questions, please contact Myron Yancey or Larry Curry.

The State Fair session runs during the last 6 days of the fair, Wednesday September 2 thru Monday September 7th. We will have volunteer sign-up sheets for this activity as well. We run 3 shifts per day, 10-2, 2-6, and 6-10. We can have up to 10 people per shift, depending on the number of lathes we have. We have been able to do this with 18-26 volunteers over the 6 days with many doing multiple shifts. More volunteers make the event easier for everyone. Participation includes free admission on the day you turn and a free parking pass. This is a great opportunity to talk to folks in the community and to find new club members. I, Bob Hutchinson, will be coordinating the turning at the fair again this year so I should be able to answer any of your questions.

We still have more activities for the summer including demos for our monthly meetings; workshops, sawdust sessions and occasional wood gathering. These are all activities that paid members can enjoy.

## **Beads of Courage program**



Mark Choitz has volunteered to send lidded boxes to the AAW Symposium in June for the Beads of Courage program that AAW supports. If anyone wants to participate just bring your finished lidded box to the May 14<sup>th</sup> meeting and Mark will box em up and mail em off. The Beads of Courage program supports kids going through serious illness like cancer. There is more information on the AAW Symposium website. Mark's goal is to send 5 boxes - since he will be turning one we only need 4 now!

AAW members donate handmade boxes to Beads of Courage, a nonprofit that provides innovative, arts-in-medicine supportive care programs to transform the treatment experience for children coping with serious illness. Through the Beads of Courage, children receive a unique bead to represent each procedure or treatment. For example, a red bead for each blood transfusion, a yellow bead for each night in the hospital, a star bead for surgery, a white bead for chemotherapy. Their collection of beads becomes a tangible record of their journey. Each wood turned box will be used to hold a sick child's precious beads.

- If possible, engrave, or burn "Beads of Courage" on the lid.
- Make sure lids are easily removable.
- Finials or knobs should be easy for a small child to grasp and not too elaborate or pointed.

In order to sufficiently hold beads, turned boxes need to be no smaller than 6" (15cm) in diameter.

• Sign your name or write "American Association of Woodturners" on the bottom.

For this to work effectively, the entire order must be paid for when your in-stock items are picked up. While I'm not equipped to accept credit cards, cash or check are both fine.
